

HABITAT: Our records come from a barrier island with extensive areas of sandy beach, dune grassland, maritime scrub, and brackish marsh habitats. Most records shown on the Moth Photographer's website for the Atlantic slope also appear to come mainly from tidewater areas. Several species of Amaranth occur along the edges of coastal marshes, including <i>Amaranthus cannabinus, Amaranthus australis</i>, and the very rare <i>Amaranthus pumilus</i> is restricted to ocean beaches and sand flats. Of these species, <i>Amaranthus cannabinus</i> has a range that best corresponds to that of <i>S. trivinctella </i>

FOOD: Larvae have been recorded on Amaranths, including <i>A. hybridus</i> and <i>A. retroflexus</i> (Robinson et al., 2010)
