

HABITAT: Our sole record for this species comes from the crest of a north-facing slope covered with mesic hardwoods

FOOD: Larvae have been recorded on Birch, including Paper Birch (Eichlin and Duckworth, 1988). Yellow or Sweet Birch seem the most likely at the site where this species has been found in North Carolina

OBSERVATION METHODS:

NATURAL HERITAGE PROGRAM RANKS: GNR S1S3

STATE PROTECTION: Has no legal protection, although permits are required to collect it on state parks and other public lands.

COMMENTS: This is a species associated with Northern Hardwoods and the site where this species has been collected in North Carolina appears to be located approximately 800 miles south of the next nearest record.
