
Tornos scolopacinaria Dimorphic Gray Moth

HABITAT: The majority of our records come from Longleaf Pine savannas and flatwoods. Other records come from in or near old fields.

FOOD: Larvae have been recorded on <i>Symphyotrichum ericoides</i> (=<i>Aster multiflorus</i>), <i>Coreopsis auriculata</i>, and <i>Coreopsis grandiflora</i> (Rindge, 1954); other members of the Compositae seem likely to be used.
