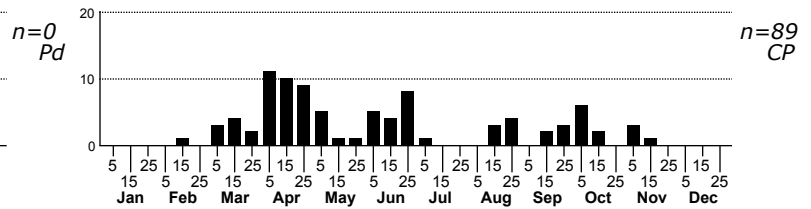
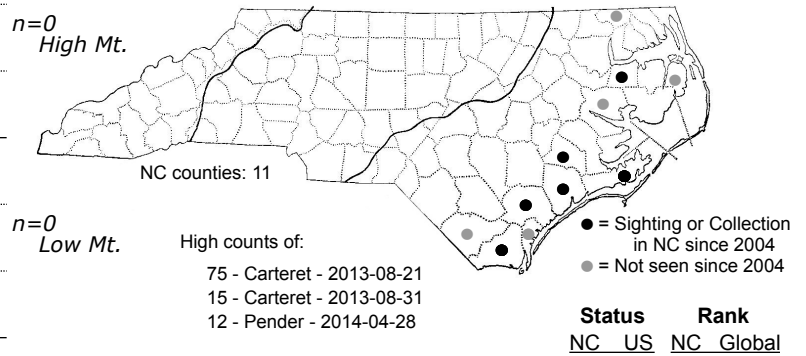
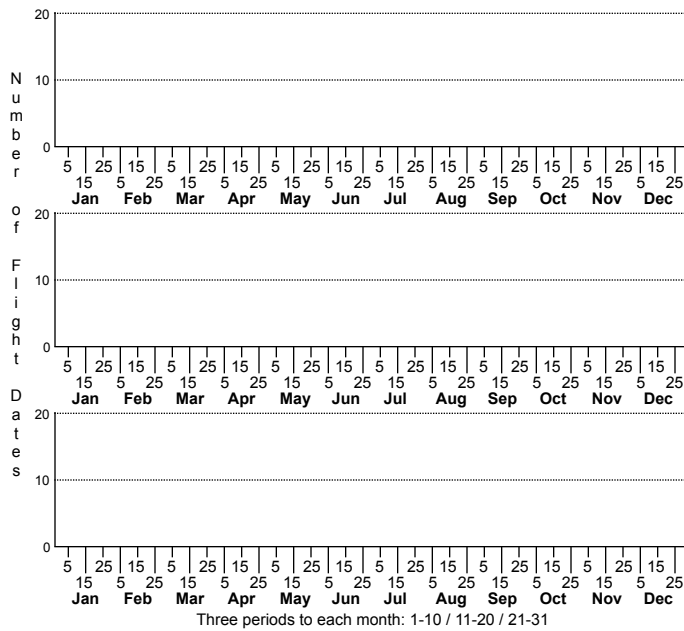


Pero zalissaria No common name

HABITAT: North Carolina records come primarily from open, herb-dominated habitats in the Coastal Plain, with many records from maritime dunes on the barrier islands and from flatwoods, savannas, and sand ridges dominated by Longleaf Pines. A few records also come from peatland habitats.

FOOD: Larvae have been reported to feed on *Myrica gale* (Robinson et al., 2010), but given the range of *zalissaria* in North Carolina, species of *Morella* look more likely to be the primary hosts in this state.
