
Metarranthis duaria Ruddy Metarranthis Moth



FAMILY: Geometridae SUBFAMILY: Ennominae TRIBE: Anagogini TAXONOMIC_COMMENTS: One of thirteen species in this genus currently recognized as occurring in North America north of Mexico (Pohl et al., 2016). Twelve have been recorded in North Carolina.

HABITAT:

FOOD: Larvae have apparently not been observed in the wild, but larvae reared from eggs feed on birch, blueberry, and cherry (Wagner et al., 2001). A long list of woody species are mentioned on BugGuide (accessed 2010-01-02) for this species but without any information on whether they were observed in the wild or reared (only one larval photo is shown, representing a captive rearing)
