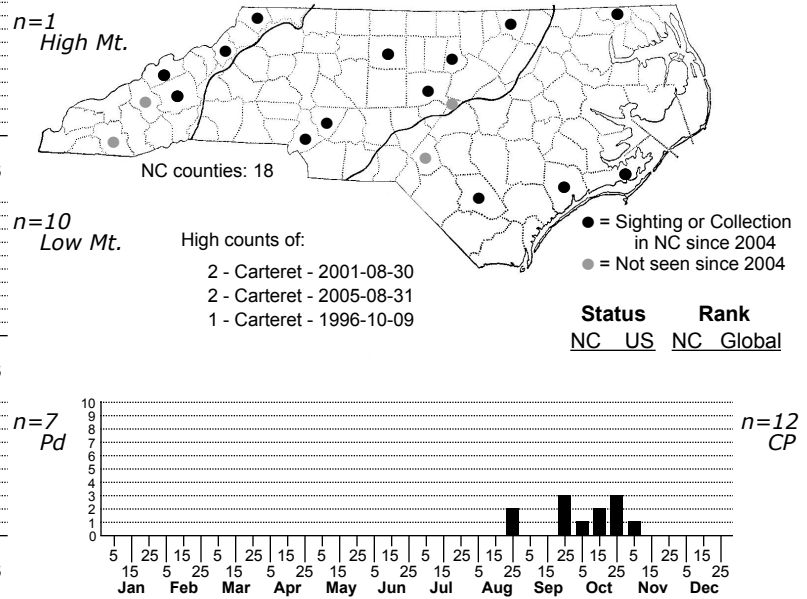
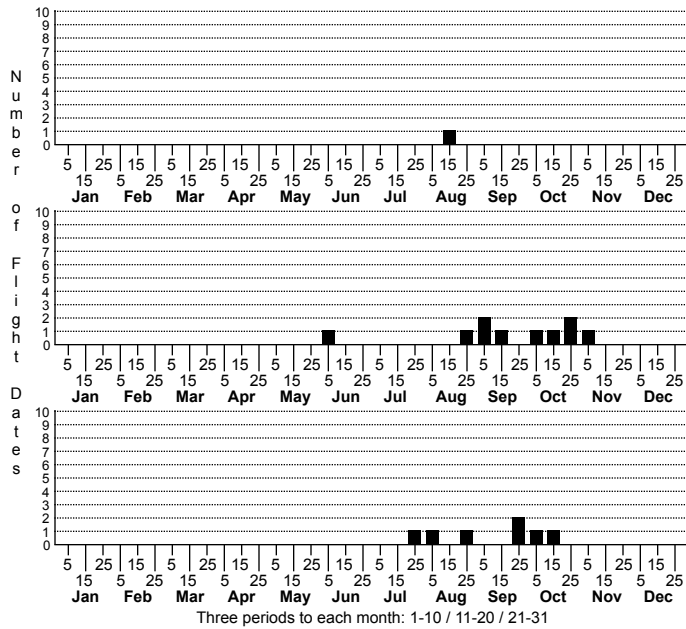


Anomis erosa Yellow Scallop Moth

HABITAT: Habitats are mainly open, including brushlands, croplands, marshes (Wagner et al., 2011). Wagner (2005) specifically lists Hollyhock (<i>Alcea rosea</i>), Upland Cotton (<i>Gossypium hirsutum</i>) and <i>Hibiscus</i>. We do not have any feeding records in North Carolina.

FOOD: Larvae feed on many species in the Malvaceae, including cultivated species and native mallows (Wagner et al., 2011)
