

HABITAT: Coastal Plain records come from the edges of pocosins and other wetlands. Mountain records come from both alluvial forests and mesic slopes, including some at high elevations. In both areas, the distribution of the moth strongly parallels the distribution of Clethra.

FOOD: Larvae feed on Clethra, with Clethra alnifolia confirmed and C. acuminata presumed based on distributional patterns (Wagner et al., 2011)
