

HABITAT: Wagner et al. (2011) list fields, waste lots, and other open habitats as used by this species. However, almost all of our records come from pond, lake, and stream shorelines, which would be more consistent with an association with Sida spinosa or other members of the Mallow family.

FOOD: Wagner et al. (2011) report finding two larvae on Bindweed but other possible members of this species on Sida spinosa
