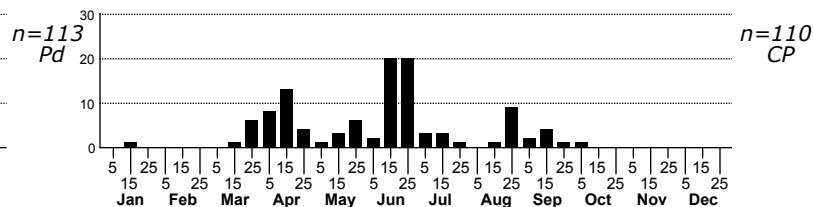
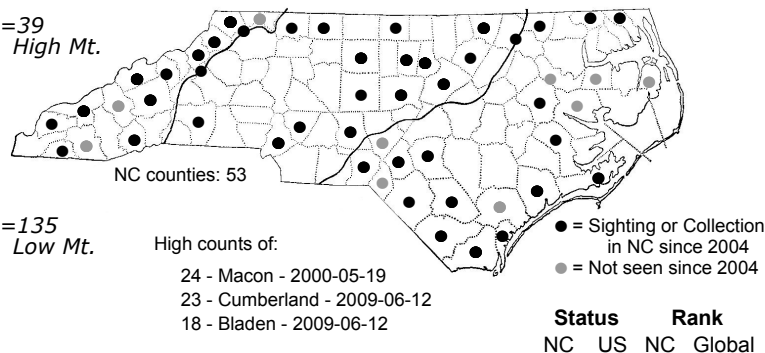
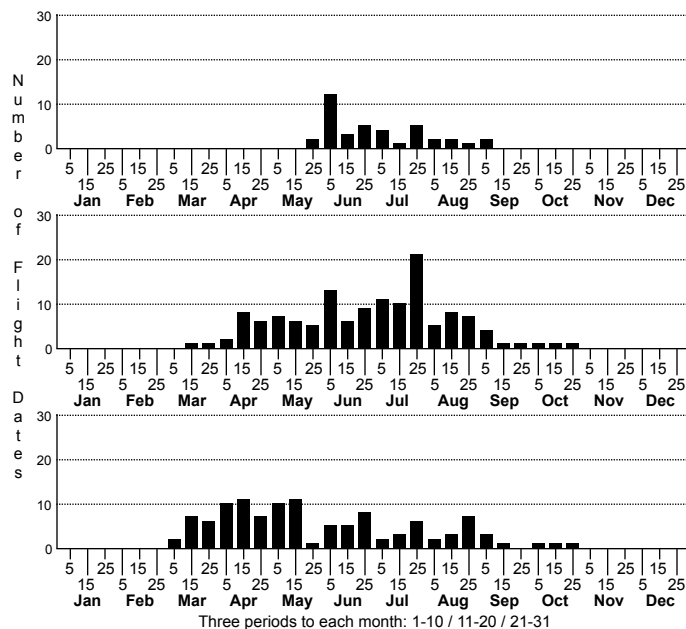


Elaphria versicolor Variegated Midget Moth

FOOD: Larvae have been reared on epiphytic algae, bark, galls, fruit, and foliage and have been observed on a number of different deciduous and coniferous trees and shrubs (Wagner et al., 2011). The details of the diet still need to be determined.
