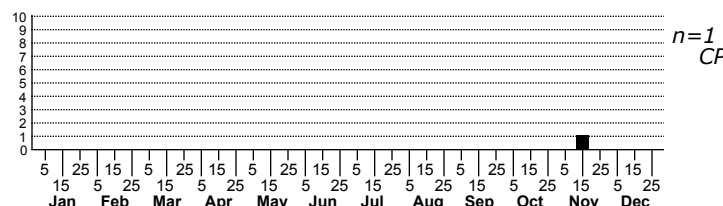
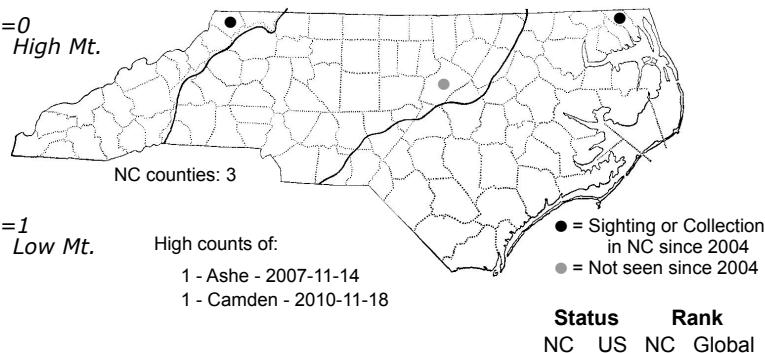
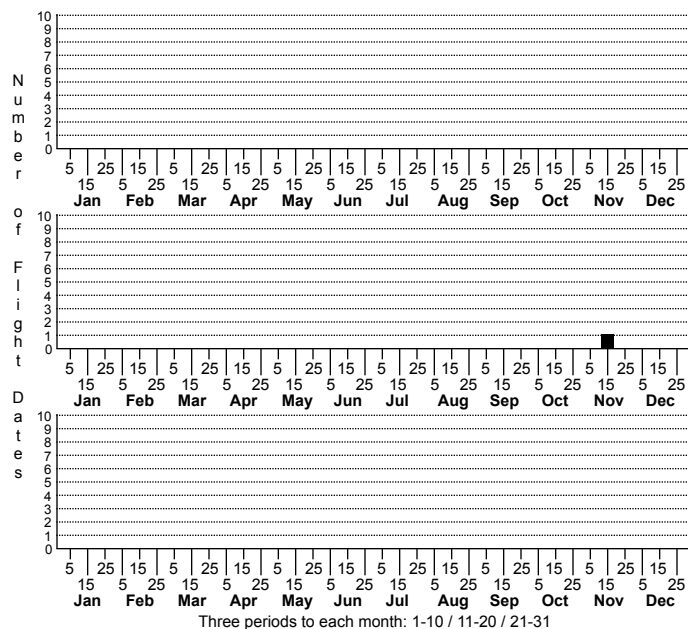


Lithophane laticinerea No common name

HABITAT: Our two records come from wet forests, one from a montane riparian forest and one from a non-riverine swamp forest in the Coastal Plain

FOOD: Larvae feed primarily on Maples, including Red and Silver (Wagner et al., 2011). Other confirmed records come from Basswood, Crab Apple, and Black Oak.
