

ID COMMENTS: This is an orange species that is very similar to P. pettiti but has somewhat more pointed forewings and has either straight or slightly curved medial and postmedial lines (Troubridge, 2020). The lower lobe of the reniform has a dark gray filling (also seen in other members of this genus). As in pettiti, the postmedian has well-marked points at the veins.
