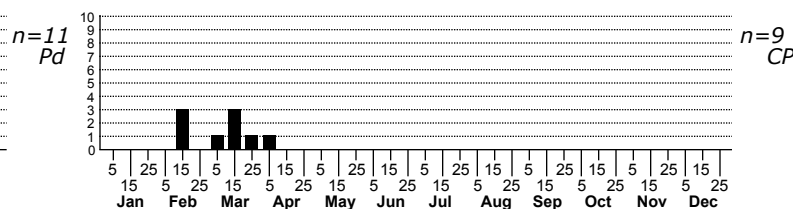
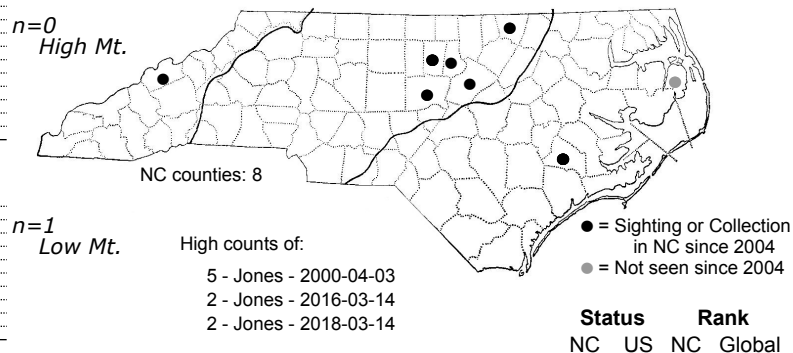
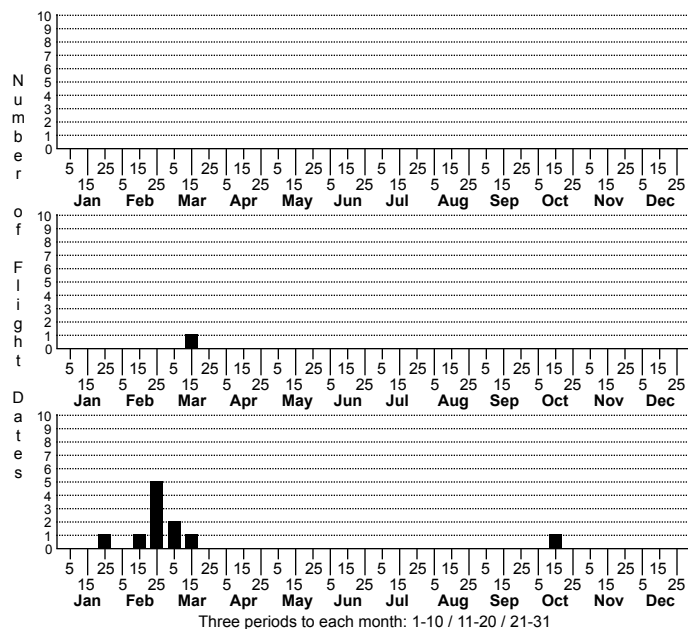

ID COMMENTS: This is an orange species that is very similar to *P. pettiti* but has somewhat more pointed forewings and has either straight or slightly curved medial and postmedial lines (Troubridge, 2020). The lower lobe of the reniform has a dark gray filling (also seen in other members of this genus). As in *pettiti*, the postmedian has well-marked points at the veins.
